Belize health & safety update effective July 12, 2022, the Belize tourism board advises that the government of Belize has decided to remove all public health measures at the points of entry in Belize (land and sea).

Effective July 12, 2022, all foreign tourists entering Belize will have the option to purchase the Belize travel insurance. It is no longer mandatory but is highly recommended by the Belize tourism board.

Transportation To/From Carmelita Gardens

Now it's time to make your way to Carmelita Gardens...

Carmelita Gardens is located about 70 miles from the Philip Goldson International Airport [BZE], roughly a 2 hour drive. Along the way you will pass through many small towns and villages, full of local flare and flavor. You will see some wonderful landmarks and the locations for some incredible excursion sites, like the "Sleeping Maya", the Belize Zoo, ATM Caves, and more.

Transportation To/From Carmelita Gardens Shuttle Service

We partner with a local shuttle service, Xplore Inland Tours, to transport our guests to/from Carmelita Gardens. The wonderful staff at Xplore Inland Tours is certified with the BTB as a Gold Standard Tour Operator and Transportation Service. They meet the heightened cleanliness, health & safety, and customer service standards set by the BTB and are rated highly by sites like TripAdvisor.

After you pass through Immigration & Customs, you will exit the airport and walk outside to the curb for pickup. You will be greeted by a driver for Xplore Inland Tours with a sign bearing your name. They will help you load your luggage, and you will be on your way to Carmelita Gardens.

Shuttle service must be pre-arranged by Carmelita Gardens.

Transportation To/From Carmelita Gardens Rental Cars

If you will be staying for an extended period, we STRONGLY recommend renting a car. A rental car is a great way of traveling through Belize, providing you with the freedom to roam and experience the country.

Upon exiting the International Airport, you will see the various <u>auto-rental companies</u> directly across the parking lot. Based on factors such as a quality vehicles, accessible/helpful customer service, and fair pricing; we recommend using one of the three rental companies listed below.

These companies have established reputations, providing 24-hour emergency road-side assistance, various offices around the country, and will provide maps/GPS units (depending on the vehicle).

You can also rent a car locally in San Ignacio.

^{*} Suggestion: If you do not have an International Phone Plan during your time in Belize, consider talking to your auto-rental company about a cell phone. Many companies provide a basic cell phone with the rental, or at a small fee. This will assist with local phone calls and communication with our Carmelita Gardens staff. These phones are most often prepaid phones that you can reload with credits at most convenience stores and many shops throughout the country.


